DEER PARK - SILVER RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOLS AWARD!

It is with huge excitement that after determination and a lot of dedication, we achieved our Silver Accreditation on 14th March. UNICEF has recognised all of our school's culture and ethos revolves around the UNCRC and that our students play 'leading roles in promoting rights'. More specifically, our hard-working focus groups and student-led teams were recognised for being a key part of our community, that betters not only our school, but the students who take part in them. Diversity (Article 2 - no discrimination) was credited for being upheld by our pupils, saying that 'students shared their confidence in addressing discriminatory language'. Our eco focus group was also congratulated for their engagement in a local air quality campaign in conjunction with the local council.

The UNICEF UK Rights Respecting Schools initiative is aimed at schools across the UK, including those in an early years setting. Currently, it works with nearly 5,000 primary schools, secondary schools, schools for children and young people with special educational needs and pupil referral units across England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. Schools have reported a positive impact on pupil behaviour, relationships and well-being by enhancing pupils' self-esteem, leading to less truancy and bullying,

better learning and improved academic standards.
